



## OUR IMPACT AND INFLUENCE

### LET'S TALK

Research shows a child's early years matter the most when it comes to "hard-wiring" his or her brain for success in school, work and life. Last year, roughly 400 new members of the community were born at DeKalb Health. The United Way launched a Let's Talk Gift and Milestone mailer to nearly 98% of those families in DeKalb County and followed it up with nearly 200 newsletters at three and nine month milestones.

After school and throughout the summer, children were invited to participate in twenty-four sessions of Let's Talk Book Buddies, which took place over an eight week period at the Children First Center, JE Ober and the Garrett Public Library. This program was able to reach 29 children of various ages ranging from one—thirteen. United Way funded this program and partnered with Early Childhood Alliance (ECA) to ensure each participant received a book and manipulative from each session they attended.

United Way also equipped in home case managers at the Children First Center, Bowen Center, GKB Early Head Start, and Early Childhood Alliance Parents as Teachers with 140 story bags that included age appropriate books and manipulatives for families with kids ranging from infants— five years old.







Did you know? Our local United Way handed out 1,092 books during the DeKalb County Fair and nearly 300 books at DeKalb Health's Healthy Halloween last year.

We ensure that children get a strong start in life by helping them achieve crucial developmental milestones and start school ready to succeed.

### KINDGERGARTEN COUNTDOWN CAMP







United Way of DeKalb County is working to give kids a strong start with Kindergarten Countdown Camp, a readiness program. The four-week program is offered at two different sites in DeKalb County, DeKalb Central and Garrett, and has helped more than 80 students. How successful is it? Last year, Kindergarten Countdown Camp achieved a 17% gain in pre-literacy skills.

Students received a complimentary book each day of class totaling twenty new books per child as well as a backpack loaded with school supplies for the upcoming year. We are grateful for the generosity of Mike and Jeff Lauer of Anytime Fitness in Auburn for their handmade bookshelf donation to every child who participated in K-Camp.

#### POWER OF THE PURSE

April 20, 2018 marked the 12th annual Power of the Purse fundraising event at the ACD Museum in Auburn . Approximately 550 attendees gathered for a chance to win one of the 132 donated purses. This event raised more than \$50,000 and will assist in funding Community Impact Grants and Early Learning initiatives for all of DeKalb County. These programs are instrumental in funding Story Bags, Born to Read mailers, Maternity Ward visits, Kindergarten Countdown Camp and Early Learning Staff Training to name a few.







#### DAY OF CARING



United Way's Day of Caring brought together more than 450 energetic volunteers from 35 companies to take on 43 service projects throughout DeKalb County. Volunteers spent their time painting, landscaping, building ramps, and much more, adding over \$22,000 in value to the community. Day of Caring is the single largest one-day, community-wide volunteer event in Northeastern Indiana.
